Message from the Stewardship Committee: Reopening plan

Many of you are asking about when the church will reopen for in-person services and under what conditions. Much work has been going on behind the scenes by our church leaders to address this in what is a most challenging time for church life. One of the main conditions for reopening is the ability to effectively live-stream our services, so we can continue to reach many of you who cannot or choose not to attend in person. So there are two components to consider: 1) The reopening plan recently approved by Session, and 2) an appeal for funding for purchasing new live-streaming equipment.

First, about reopening. Our new target date for returning to live worship is August 2. For this to happen, we must prepare to comply with all Covid-related regulations and use good common sense to protect our most vulnerable people; the recent survey we conducted of the congregation affirms broad consensus on this point. Preparation includes sanitizing the facility, training worship leaders and ushers, and communicating to you specific requirements and instructions.

Worship Broadcast Equipment capital fund -- \$30,000

Second, to be able to provide for a high-quality live-streamed worship experience on YouTube™, we need to purchase state-of-the-art audio-visual equipment beyond what we currently have. Session has approved a \$30k capital funding drive for this purpose. Some donations have already come in enabling us to get started, but more is needed soon. Therefore, we ask for you to prayerfully consider donating to this fund to help us reach our operational milestones as soon as we can. We believe live-streaming is critical for the viability of our church, not just for now, but also for the long term. Many churches are already streaming. Donations can be dropped off or mailed to the church office. Please indicate that your donation is intended for worship broadcast equipment.

We ask for your prayers and financial support as we implement our plan to reopen the church for in-person services with simultaneous high-quality live-streaming on YouTube™ to help us stay united as a congregation. We praise God for the freedom to worship, and we thank you all for your steadfast support.




1 I sing the might-y power of God that made the moun-tains rise,

With minimal revision this text brings together six of the eight four-line stanzas in an 18th-century hymn written for children and originally headed "Praise for Creation and Providence." The anonymous German tune provides a fitting sense of breadth and wonder.

Although this hymn is often used on large and festive occasions, its first two stanzas had much humbler beginnings: they originated as a family table prayer during the Thirty Years' War (1618–1648). These words have been associated with this tune since the mid-17th century.
