Letter from the Pastor

Sunday, June 4 is an important Sunday here at FPC, Manhattan!

Not only is it the first Sunday in June, marking the start of our beloved Parkside Worship Service – outdoors in Friendship Park at 8:30am – but it is also the start of our First Sunday Summer Potlucks (June 4, July 2, August 6)! And, between you and me, I think the heavenly banquet we hear so much about in Scripture will look an awful lot like a church potluck. I love them! People bringing, from their own homes, dishes they love to make and share with others; the luck of the draw by way of what will be available, but no one complaining because such a feast has something for everyone; fellowship around tables with people with whom we might not ordinarily gather; stories told; laughter shared; life as a community of faith nurtured and the Spirit of God blowing where it will as bonds of fellowship are strengthened and something resembling the Kingdom of Heaven is reflected in the family of faith. Truly, I've never met a potluck I didn't love. And I hope you'll make it a priority in your day to join in the party, and bring a dish to pass.

June 4 also marks Trinity Sunday. Unlike other festivals in the church's liturgical calendar, Trinity Sunday centers on a doctrine of the church, rather than an event. It celebrates the unfathomable mystery of God's being as Holy Trinity. It is a day of adoration and praise of the One, Eternal, Incomprehensible God. In a sense, Trinity Sunday, synthesizes all we have celebrated over the past months which have centered on God's mighty acts: Christmas-Epiphany; Lent-Easter; Pentecost. It is a fitting transition to that part of the year when Sunday by Sunday the work of God among us is unfolded in a more general way. And so, as we mark each passing Sunday, and our own growing into the fullness of Christ, we see a change in the liturgical colors in the sanctuary from the *white* of Easter celebration, to the *red* of the Spirit's work, witness, and power at Pentecost, to the *green* of Ordinary Time. This is the color we see most often in the year: the color of leaves, fields, grass...of growing.

And that's all just on the first Sunday of the month! Check out this newsletter for other important, worthwhile, meaningful, and fun events and activities that are taking place this month. And as June unfolds (and with it the seasons change from spring to summer) may your hearts, minds, and lives continue to grow, bloom, and be changed from one degree of glory to another. May you know what is the hope to which you have been called, what are the riches of God's glorious inheritance among the saints, and what is the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. (Ephesians 1:18-19)
