### **Letter from the Pastor**

The expressions of prayer are as varied as the people of God.

May the fourth is not just a date that Star Wars fans love (If you know Star Wars then you'll get it). This year, it is also the first Thursday of the month, designated as the National Day of Prayer. To my knowledge there are no prayer gatherings in Manhattan on this day (something we should perhaps remedy as a Ministerial Association). But my past experience with this day of prayer has been life-changing: women, men and children from across the Judeo-Christian tradition gathering to acknowledge the sovereignty of God over all creation, and our need to humble ourselves before God and ask for God's forbearance, guidance, wisdom, and help, as we make our way forward as a global community that struggles with justice, equity, righteousness, mercy, and peace, just to name a few things.

To be sure, many folk within the Christian tradition pray differently than me. Some raise their hands. Some speak in tongues. Some sing as they pray. Others weep. Still others are very solemn, stately, measured in their prayers. The expressions of prayer are as varied as the people of God. And that has been a great part of this life-changing experience. The other major component has been rather shocking in its simplicity: whenever I've participated in this day of prayer with others from across the community, it's been invigorating to see people who look different than me. Black, white, brown, young and old, male and female, those with luscious locks of hair! It is a living testament to the church of Jesus Christ being so much bigger than a particular congregation or denomination; a reminder that none of us "corners the market" on God, indeed that God won't be put into anyone's pocket or box (often labeled: "Charismatic," "Evangelical," "Orthodox," "Reformed," "Catholic," "Mainline," and so on). And I, for one, truly value that perspective – it is both deeply humbling and deeply comforting.

This year's theme for the *National Day of Prayer* comes from James 5:16b "The prayer of the righteous is powerful and effective." And, in context, it is a reference to James' call for the community of faith to lift one another up in prayer, trusting that God will be the one to heal, restore, and forgive. And it is as good a place to start as anywhere. So, on May the fourth I invite you to set aside some time during the day (or throughout the day) to engage in intentional prayer for this community, this state, this nation, and God's world; to pray for healing, restoration, forgiveness and reconciliation, wholeness, justice, and peace – trusting that God will hear, and is already at work within (and around) us all. If you are connected to First Pres. on Facebook and/or Instagram, you will be able to join throughout the day in what is called the "A.C.T.S." form of prayer (Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, and Supplication). But, as I have already stated, there are as many ways to pray as there are people who do it. So lift up your heart, mind, and spirit, and pray knowing that you are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses (nod to Hebrews 12:1) whose hearts and voices are joined with your own in seeking God's face, pleading for God's mercy, and humbly following where God leads.



The "Ascension of the Lord" is observed 40 days after Easter – as we read in Acts 1:3 – and we celebrate it on the Sunday nearest the date. Thus, May 21 is Ascension Sunday at First Presbyterian Church, Manhattan!

But what is it? Simply put, it is the day we remember Jesus' ascension into heaven (just as the creeds state) where he sits at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty. Why is it so important? The Ascension of the Lord is more than simply a nod to some historical event, or even theological concept. It is the proclamation of the church, and celebration of the people of God, that God's promises are true in Jesus; that we (our whole self – body, mind, and spirit) are important to God; that all of our humanity is wrapped up with Jesus and is present with, and precious to, God. It is the affirmation that our hope has been placed wisely in Jesus.

In that John Calvin's theology placed great importance on the ascended and reigning Christ, Ascension Day is in some ways the Presbyterian feast day. Christ is Lord of the world and head of the church, we proclaim. Christ's ascension, therefore, concerns us not only with church-related matters but also with social and political ones. If Christ has ascended, then Christ's word rules the world as well as the church. If Christ has ascended, then there are no other rulers – all others are merely pretenders. Christ reigns supreme.



Please set your calendars, and make sure to worship on Sunday, May 21, Ascension of the Lord Sunday!
