# CONFESSION

*I'm Sorry*

Almighty God: you alone are good and holy. Purify our lives and make us brave disciples. We do not ask you to keep us safe, but to keep us loyal, so we may serve Jesus Christ, who, tempted in every way as we are, was faithful to you.

From lack of reverence for truth and beauty; from a calculating or sentimental mind; from going along with mean and ugly things, forgive us.

From cowardice that dares not face the truth; laziness content with half-truths; or arrogance that thinks it knows it all, forgive us.

From artificial life and worship; from all that is hollow or insincere, forgive us.

From trite ideals and cheap pleasures; from mistaking hard vulgarity for humor, forgive us.

From being dull, pompous, or rude; from putting down neighbors, forgive us.

From cynicism about our brothers and sisters; from intolerance or cruel indifference, forgive us.

From being satisfied with things as they are, in the church or in the world; from failing to share your indignation, forgive us.

From selfishness, self-indulgence, or self-pity, forgive us.

From token concern for the poor, for lonely or loveless people; from confusing faith with good feelings, or love with a wanting to be loved, forgive us.

For everything in us that may hide your light—O God, light of life, forgive us.

**Spend some time honestly “coming clean” with God. What things have been done, or left undone, that need forgiveness and reconciliation? How might you be (or how have you been) wrapped up in actions or systems that perpetuate hurts, injustices, or even apathies? Confess these to God, who is evermore ready to forgive than we are to seek out forgiveness.**

Great God: you hear our prayers before we speak, and answer before we know our need. Though we cannot pray, may your Spirit pray in us, drawing us to you and toward our neighbors on earth.

We pray for the whole creation: may all things work together for good, until, by your design, people inherit the earth and order it wisely. Let the whole creation praise you, Lord and God.

We pray for the church of Jesus Christ; that, begun, maintained, and promoted by your Spirit, it may be true, engaging, glad, and active, doing your will. Let the church be always faithful, Lord and God.

We pray for men and women who serve the church in special ways, preaching, ruling, showing charity; that they may never lose heart, but have all hope encouraged. Let leadership be strong, Lord and God.

We pray for people who do not believe, who are shaken by doubt, or have turned against you. Open their eyes to see beyond our broken fellowship the wonders of your love displayed in Jesus, and to follow when he calls them. Conquer doubt with faith, O God.
